TASTING NOTES

Dive into a bracing, deep pool of texture with this 2019 coastally influenced, ridgetop Cabernet Sauvignon. Powerful, refreshing and showcasing incredible clarity and lift, aromas of briar, blueberry, and mint fill the glass. The combination of taut acid and fore mouth focus balance out the intensity gained by warm days, cool evenings, and thin rocky soils. The wine evokes the sea and rugged mountains with delightful purity and elegance. Ready for anything from Peking Duck to wild mushroom pasta, the combination of cool savory and bright ripeness allow this wine to seamlessly pair with an incredible range of food or situations.

Our Single Estate Series represents our purest expressions of place. Having worked with the fruit from tens of vineyards over the years, we have identified three special sites that we believe create extraordinary wine. Produced in limited quantities, these wines have ultra-developed acid and tannin profiles and achieve a beautiful balance of intense structure and bright aromatics.
